Statewide Poll Shows Kansans Want Those in Need to Have Access to Medical Cannabis

A statewide poll of Kansas voters sends a message that Kansans want the Legislature to pursue Medical Cannabis Legislation. The poll also shows Kansans, including those against cannabis, will continue to look favorably on Legislators who vote in favor of medical cannabis laws.

The poll, conducted by research firm HLC Strategies, shows that **70.3% of Kansans** support medical cannabis legislation compared to just 22.1% who oppose. When asked if they would continue to support a Legislator who votes for medical cannabis legislation, even if that voter personally opposes, 78.1% said they would continue to support their Legislator.

“Kansans recognize that a regulated medical cannabis program would help numerous Kansans who suffer from debilitating medical conditions,” said Spencer Duncan, Director of the Kansas Cannabis Industry Association. “The people of Kansas are asking elected officials to start having real conversations in the Capital about the future of medical cannabis in our state.”

The results:

70.3% support medical cannabis legislation; 22.1% oppose medical cannabis legislation; 7.6% undecided.

How confident are you that medical cannabis is helpful for people struggling with pain? 74.1% confident; 11.6% not confident; 14.36% unsure

Regardless of your personal view, would you view a Kansas Legislator who voted in favor of legalization more favorable, less favorably, or would it not make much difference? 40.1% more favorably; 19% Less Favorably; 38% Not much difference; 2.9% don't know
